Re: June 2024 Headmistress's Letter

We have had a busy term so far with frequent communications at this stage in the year regarding different trips, events, exams and performances. I must thank you in advance for reading the communications and for supporting the variety of activities we have to enhance the learning experience in every stage across the school.

### **Staff reminders**

Mrs Gadd, who returned from maternity leave in March, will be moving across to Oaklands School from September 2024 to take up a part-time position as Science teacher. Mrs Gadd has been a Junior teacher for a number of years and has been instrumental in introducing Philosophy to the Junior curriculum. She is also the PSHE and Humanities subject lead for the Juniors. Mrs Gadd will be missed and we wish her all the best 'down the road'!

I am very pleased to announce that Mrs Adams (who covered Mrs Gadd's Maternity Leave) will become a full time member of staff across the school in September. Mrs Adams remains the Junior French teacher as well as being a class teacher.

## **End of Year and INCAS exam preparations**

Please be aware that Senior pupils will have their End of Year Exams the week after May half term. This will be 3-7 June and the revision lists are available on Show My Homework. The expectation is that pupils will use May half term to revise for these exams. The End of Year Exams and INCAS testing for Juniors will be 10-14 June.

We have written to each year group that has exams. Senior pupils are expected to have a clear plastic pencil case with black ball point pens, ruler, eraser, pencils and a maths set for every exam. These exams will be in test conditions and the dates of the exams have been published to your portal. The feedback from these exams is very valuable.

Teachers will be giving feedback to your child in the lessons after the exams. Pupils are expected to respond to this feedback by making targets and re-modelling answers, if needed. Please discuss this feedback with your child to encourage them to learn from their areas of improvement.

If your daughter is in Year 10, please be aware that some Sixth Forms ask for a copy of their End of Year report with their Year 10 exams results on. I did state this in the End of Year Exam letter and this message has been conveyed by teachers to the pupils.

#### **Uniform reminders**

A reminder that junior pupils should be in their Summer Uniform. For Juniors this will be shorts (rather than trousers) and the blue checked summer dress. Socks for junior girls should be white short or long. Socks for boys must be short grey ankle socks or the long uniform socks from Forest Casuals. Year 6 to Year 11 should be in their kilt, shirt, blazer. Year 6 may wear tights or white socks. Year 7 to Year 11 will be wearing black tights as usual. We will notify you when socks can be worn.

The PE uniform remains the same. We do now have PE shorts for sale at Forest Casuals for the warmer weather. Please ensure that your child has ample uniform (especially for PE) so that they can be equipped for the different activities that we have coming up in the summer months.

Please ensure that all nail varnish, nail extensions and eyelash extensions are removed before your child returns to school. Make-up must not be worn. Please ensure that your child does not apply make-up before school. They will be asked to remove make-up if they are wearing it.

## **Uptake of clubs**

We have added two new clubs to the existing diet of clubs already on offer: multi sports and a specialist sports club. These clubs add variety to the already wide-ranging offer of after school provision. This was based on feedback from Junior coffee mornings in the Autumn and Spring Term. It is, therefore, disappointing to see that pupils were not then signed up to these clubs. Staff members have spent time finding a provider, interviewing them and then arranging the administration around these new clubs. As a result of the low uptake, we have run the club at a loss and will not be providing these in the future.

### **Year 3 Camp September 2024**

If your child is attending the Year 3 Camp at Oaklands School in the Autumn term, you will be invited to a short meeting on 14 June. Please do read the communication and bring along any questions that you may have about this event.

## Parking at the front of school

Please do not park in spaces allocated for staff when you are dropping your child at Breakfast Club in the morning. Pull forward adjacent to the mini bus space to allow staff to access the car park so that they can start their day promptly. Please also turn off your engines when dropping off your child or picking them up.

I have had complaints from local residents again this term about parents parking on the double yellow lines in Ardmore Lane. Yellow lines are there to protect pedestrians and to keep traffic moving. Please adhere to these signs to keep children safe at drop-off and pick-up.

### **FOBS** events

I am very grateful to FOBS who have run a pre-loved uniform sale this term, have paid for the Year 11 Leavers' Brunch and have paid for the seedlings for the Early Years Garden. In order to generate more income to support events and activities across the school, FOBS have organised the Summer Festival (disco) for pupils, which will be on 26 June. They have also organised another pizza making kit for June. Please read the communications from FOBS as last time we had a pizza making activity, some pupils were upset that they didn't have a pizza kit to take home as parents chose not to participate.

## **Culture Day**

For the first time, Braeside School will be holding a **Day of Culture on Friday 28 June**. Pupils across the school requested this day through School Council meetings. Mr Masood will be organising this day and will be asking pupils for their ideas. If you have any artefacts, recipes, cultural dress or stories that you would be willing to share with groups of pupils, we would love to hear from you! We had a great representation of careers from parents back in the Spring Term and it would be lovely to see parents sharing their knowledge once again. Please do get in touch with Mr Masood (or the Office Team) if you would like to come into school to support this event.

#### **End of term events**

There are several activities, events and visits coming up including the Aladdin performance at a local theatre. Please do read the communications carefully so that your child is adequately prepared for trips including a re-fillable bottle of water (especially now that the weather is warming up). A list of the activities and trips can be found at the end of this letter.

**Sports Day will be on Monday 24 June**. Full PE kit must be worn on this day. It would be lovely to see parents supporting this day as we have added more sporting events to the schedule.

Speech Day and the Early Years Celebration will be on Friday 5 July and pupils have already been rehearsing for this event. Full school uniform (not PE) must be worn. Please ensure that your child's uniform is clean and presentable for this event. Please ensure that they have clean shoes and that hair accessories are appropriate for a formal event.
