






Juniors

Fantastic entries for the Oak Tree Challenge Awards 2024

The Oak Tree Challenge scheme has been running successfully for 4 years now.

Two years ago, we had 19 completed entries and last year we had 27 girls who completed all their challenges and write-ups.

This year, although more than 50 girls expressed an interest at the start, 13 entries were received across both the Junior and the Senior classes by the deadline in June 2024.

The Oak Tree Challenge Scheme was designed to challenge our girls and they have proved that they went above and beyond, persevered and successfully completed their challenges both inside and outside of school. We had some articulate journal entries with good details of planning and execution of challenges and honest self-reflections, some lovely photographs too. Well done girls!

We had two ambitious entries, one for the Gold award and one for the Silver award this year. However, both girls were awarded a Certificate of Participation as the planning and reflections were not detailed enough. I hope Gracie and Freya have another go at achieving these awards next year. Well done girls!

We had 11 entries for the Bronze award and I am happy to say that all 11 girls were awarded the Bronze award certificates and lapel badges in the End of Year assembly on Wednesday 10th July. Their commitment to detail, evaluations and reflections in their write-ups were great!


Excellent research and presentation skills were demonstrated by students whilst giving presentations on the Gods in Hinduism and on-line safety.
